### Context of the research project

- Directly targeted at young people living in wards where entry to HE is lower than expected;
- The purpose was to identify the barriers for pupils entering HE.





- Two schools participated in the project;
- Workshop sessions were held with pupils from year 10 and the parents/carers of year 10 pupils;
- The research approach was Appreciative Inquiry

# An overview of some of the findings



- Family influences may impact on their perception of HE and decision making;
- Perceptions of HE attributed by previous experience at feeder school;
- Lack of self belief and motivation to consider HE;

#### An overview continued 2



- Do qualifications add value for the life of a student?;
- Fear of leaving home is a barrier to entering HE;
- Perceived positive outcomes of attending HE;
- The cost of HE is perceived as an inhibitor by both parents and students.
- Limited communication and information about HE.

#### An overview continued 3



- Health & Wellbeing issues;
- Limited number of courses;
- Qualifications needed for access;
- Limited opportunities of work experience not offered as part of the HE experience;
- Scepticism about support from feeder schools that places HE as impossible option for pupils with special needs.





- More information about types of jobs and careers;
- Provide more information about the value of HE;
- Include parents to open days and other events;
- Provide work experience, taster sessions, trips, careers advisors and more support for children who need extra help.

## Suggested actions for the government



- More government funding the biggest issue (98%);
- Pay students whilst studying at college,
- Reduce working age;
- Include accommodation as part of the HE package;
- Make it possible to gain qualifications whilst working;
- What jobs are needed in the future?

### Suggested Business/Industry actions

- Business/Industry to offer work experience;
- Work experience needs to be authentic;
- Businesses to be involved with schools and colleges to share information;
- Business to help with university funding or sponsor career paths.

### Suggested actions for HE



- Universities need more school links, workshops and taster days;
- Compulsory engagement in college visits for pupils;
- Make it easier to see how HE can get you a job;
- Regular visits to colleges and universities;
- Provide parents with full information;
- Colleges and university group evenings in school + many more.

### Suggested actions on communication

- More information shared with students and parents;
- Butterfly broadcast;
- Use events, newspapers and billboards to raise awareness;
- Information is shared in a variety of ways;
- Social media to include more news and information + more
