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The NCS Programme



NCS has 3 key aims:

Social Cohesion

Social Mobility

Social Engagement

We achieve these aims by delivering activity across four phases:

- 1. Be Epic our outward bounds phase where young people learn skills outside of their comfort zone.
- 2. Live Life where young people experience FE and HE, build their social capital, and develop new skills for their futures
- **3. Do Good** where our young people plan and deliver social action projects which benefit themselves and their local communities whilst interacting with local employers
- 4. Go Party where we celebrate the achievements of our young people with a graduation ceremony

Programme impacts



Young people who have completed the NCS programme tell us that they...

- had more skills and confidence
- believed themselves to be more resilient and were more satisfied with life
- were more trusting of people in their local community
- could better tackle problems that came their way

Furthermore

- since NCS began in 2011, over 12 million hours of social action have been delivered
- NCS supports education providers in working towards the Gatsby Benchmarks and the Ofsted framework
- NCS supports educational progression
 - o 12% more likely to go to University
 - o 50% more likely if you are from a disadvantaged background

Aspire to HE





- Aspire to HE is one of the 29 NCOP consortia, lead by the University of Wolverhampton and in partnership with six further education colleges;
- working in 29 target wards across Sandwell, Halesowen, Dudley, Walsall, Wolverhampton, and Telford and Wrekin. Within those wards, Aspire to HE has 39 partner schools each with its own Aspire to HE Lead Teacher, and 24 of those schools with Aspire to HE funded Engagement Officers providing one-to-one mentoring and group activity mapped and evaluated against a progression framework
- The six colleges at the **heart of the consortia** led by a dedicated College Partnerships Manager to oversee and monitor all FE College Aspire to HE delivery. Each has a unique delivery plan but all are challenged to identify a **target 50** of those not on a clear pathway to HE and provide **one-to-one mentoring support.**

NCS & Aspire to HE



NCS & Aspire to HE began collaborating in June 2018.

In this time, we've built a strong relationship based upon our clear alignment in strategies and have delivered some key outcomes for young people in the area which are now being used as examples/pilots of work across the NCS network.

- Initially carried out a mapping exercise of access and engagement in colleges across NCOP and NCS activity to understand greatest potential opportunities
- Supported the recruitment and funding for the first ever **NCOP exclusive NCS programme** at Dudley College, **removing the financial barrier to NCS** for NCOP learners which proved to be a great success
- Now involved in the planning of a **new pilot** which will see the Aspire to HE staff working in schools and colleges also supporting NCS activity as **Aspire to HE NCS Champions**.
