HEIFES18 Workbook Table Exercises

You should refer to the HEIFES18 guidance document, when completing these exercises.

Please note:

- Each course description includes data that is applicable to more than one table. However, no individual course will need you to fill in all the tables.
- In these examples, when considering fundability status for Home and EU students we have considered only ELQ status. In reality, other criteria may apply to make them non-fundable.
