

Introduction to OfS funding



Who we are

- We are the independent regulator for higher education in England.
- We aim to ensure that every student, whatever their background, has a fulfilling experience of higher education that enriches their lives and careers.
- Our work covers all students:
 - undergraduate or postgraduate
 - young or mature
 - full-time or part-time
 - studying on a campus or by distance learning
 - regardless of nationality.



OfS funding powers

- The OfS was established in the Higher Education and Research Act of 2017 (HERA) as the independent regulator of higher education in England.
- We distribute government funding to registered providers:
 - given to 300+ providers in England in 2020-21
 - registered in the Approved (fee cap) category
 - supplementary funding to student tuition fees.




OfS teaching grant budget

- Annual budget established through guidance letter from the Secretary of State, along with policy areas to prioritise.
- OfS board determines budgets for different elements of the grant and their distribution.

OfS funding methods

- Our funding helps to ensure the availability of high-quality, cost-effective higher education across the country. Funding helps support objectives including:
 - student choice and diversity of provision
 - high standard of provision and student experience
 - equality of opportunity.
- We do this by investing in:
 - high-cost subjects at undergraduate and postgraduate levels, including medicine, science, engineering and agriculture, and strategically important and vulnerable subjects
 - world-leading specialist providers
 - part-time provision and other flexible modes of delivery.




Elements of recurrent grant for 2020-21

Student data collection



Student data and funding

- Grants are formulaic and informed by student data.
- We fund teaching activity by using student data as a proxy measure.
- Student data used to inform funding allocations:
 - Aggregate HESES and Higher Education Students Forecast (HESF) data returns
 - Individualised HESA and ILR student records.
- This student data is then used in our formula funding allocations.





Changes in HESES20



Changes in HESES20

- **Non-completion estimates:** clarifying guidance for estimated non-completions, these should be based on historical non-completion data and not skewed by exceptional circumstances, e.g. coronavirus (COVID-19).
- Fundability definition: Home and EU eligible students definitions expanded to include:
 - persons granted indefinite leave to remain as a victim of domestic violence or domestic abuse
 - persons granted Calais leave.



Changes in HESES20 (continued)

• **Tables 6a, 6b and 6c:** changes to simplify collection of information about students on certain pre-registration nursing, midwifery, and allied health courses, along with certain dentistry courses.


