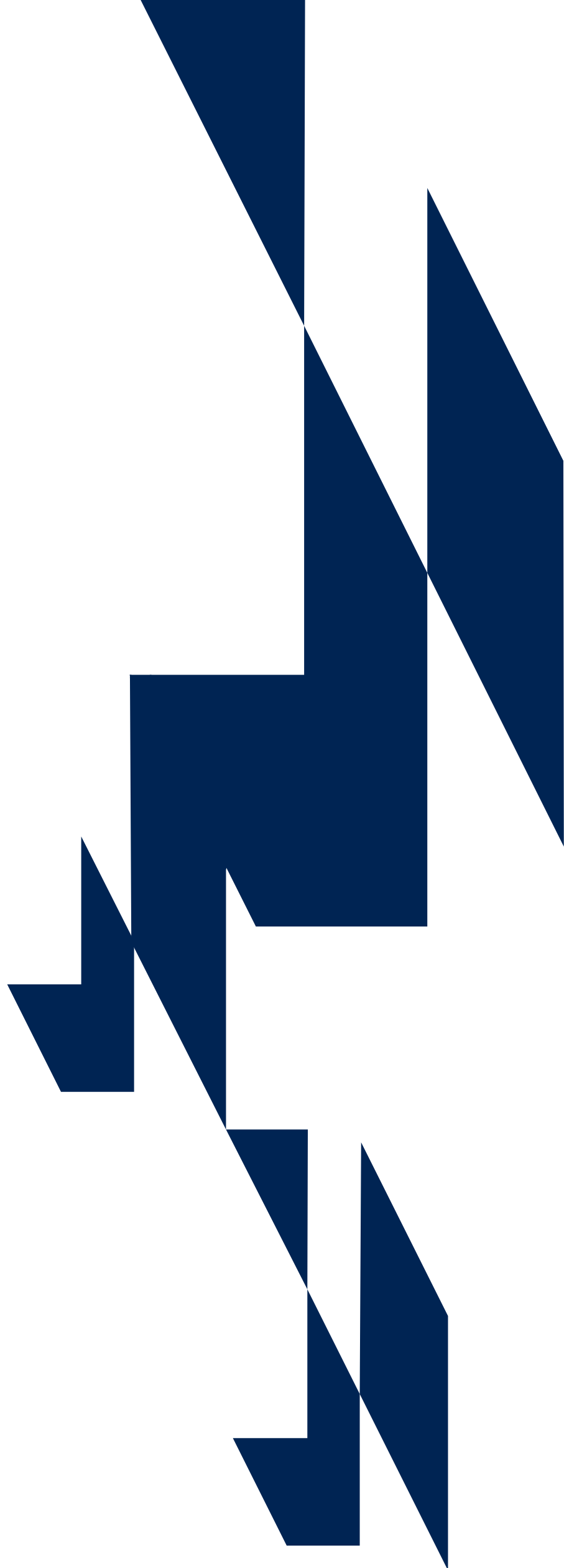

- All students are new entrants, because they are now studying at PG level.
