1. Introduction

Discover Uni is the independent resource for higher education ran by the UK funding and regulatory bodies for Higher Education, which includes the Office for Students, the Scottish Funding Council, the Higher Education Funding Council for Wales and the Department for the Economy (Northern Ireland).

4. How we will use your information

We can only use your personal information where we have a specific purpose or purposes for doing so.

We will use your personal data to contact you for further feedback on Discover Uni developments only.

To achieve the above aims, the specific uses that will be made of your personal information are listed below:

- To feedback on website developments
- To seek your views in your capacity as an adviser or teacher on Discover Uni
- To invite you to participate in future surveys, workshops or related consultative activity in your capacity as an adviser or teacher

If we want to use your personal information for a reason other than those purposes set out above, we will tell you before we start that use and provide further information about the new purpose(s).

5. Legal basis for using your personal information

Under data protection legislation, we require a legal basis to be able to process your personal information for the purposes set out above.

In this case, the legal basis is consent under Article 6(1)(a) of the GDPR 2018.

Withdrawal of consent

Consent must be a clear positive action that you have given your agreement to the use of your personal information, and consent can also be withdrawn at any point if you are no longer happy with the use of your personal information for a specific reason. Once consent is withdrawn, we will destroy all relevant personal information unless we are relying on a different legal basis to justify keeping your personal information. If that is

the case, we will tell you in writing. However, withdrawing your consent does not affect the lawfulness of processing based on consent before you withdrew consent.

6. What personal information we will collect

The personal information we will collect and use as part of this survey is set out below:

- Your name
- Your email address

7. Who we give your personal information to

We will not routinely pass your information to any other organisation except where required to do so as part of our functions or by law.

8. Where your personal information will be stored

Your personal information will be stored securely within the United Kingdom and will not be transferred outside that territory unless required by a court order.

9. How do we protect your personal information

OfS has a number of security measures in place to protect your personal information, listed below:

- Accredited to the <u>Cyber Essentials</u> PLUS standard for cyber security
- All staff are required to undertake training in data protection and information security on joining OfS and then on an annual basis;
- Formal information security policies that must be read and understood by all staff;
- Personal information is only available to those members of staff who require access as part of their role.

10. Your rights over your personal information

Once your personal information has been collected, you have certain rights in relation to that personal information that may be exercised. You have the right to request:

- A copy of your personal information;
- Inaccurate personal information held about you is corrected;
- Your personal information to be deleted;
- Processing of your personal information is restricted;
- A copy of your information in a format that allows easy transfer ("data portability");
- That you are not subject to automated decision making or profiling (if these take place).

All these rights have certain limitations depending on the request and the purpose for which we are holding your personal information. 11. How long we will hold your personal information

We are only able to retain a copy of your personal information as long as it is still needed for the purpose(s) for which it was collected. The personal information you have submitted will be kept for two years after the survey is completed.

After that point, your personal information will be confidentially and securely disposed of.

Cookies are test files placed on your computer to collect standard internet log information and visitor behaviour information. This information is used to track visitor use of the website and to complete statistical reports on website activity.
