## **Applications for a provisional Teaching Excellence and Student Outcomes Framework (TEF) award**

I am writing to you following the email from Nicola Dandridge today, with information about how to apply for a provisional TEF award.

We wrote to you on 10 June<sup>1</sup> about our decision to allow registered English providers that do not hold a TEF award to apply for a provisional award, which would be valid until the next TEF exercise produces outcomes in 2023.

This is voluntary for eligible providers. Providers without a TEF award do not need to apply for a provisional award in order to comply with registration condition B6.

Provisional TEF awards will be open to applications from providers:

- who are registered with the Office for Students (OfS); and
- who are meeting all ongoing conditions of registration; and
- who deliver undergraduate provision taught at that provider in the academic year the award is granted.<sup>2</sup>

We have written to all registered providers without a TEF award, regardless of their current eligibility, in case they become eligible at a later date. This letter does not, therefore, mean that your provider is eligible for a provisional award. We will check eligibility on receiving applications.

## How to apply for a provisional award

To apply, you as accountable officer should email [tef@officeforstudents.org.uk](mailto:tef@officeforstudents.org.uk) with the subject line 'Provisional TEF award application – [UKPRN and name of your provider]' by 26 August 2021. You do not need to submit any documents as part of your application because we have the evidence needed to determine eligibility. Once we receive an application, we will check your eligibility in relation to the above criteria, and we will write to you in September 2021 to confirm whether we have determined that you should be granted a provisional award.

We will reopen applications in summer 2022 for providers that become eligible after the August 2021 deadline, or decide not to apply this year.

## Other considerations

We have published revised branding guidelines, which advise providers that they should not promote their TEF award from September 2021.<sup>3</sup> This also applies to new provisional awards.

If you intend to apply for a provisional award and you wish to charge the inflationary fee uplift,<sup>4</sup> and you also have an approved access and participation plan (APP), you will need to indicate this in the upcoming annual fee information (AFI) return.<sup>5</sup> You should also ensure that your intended fees are clear and accessible to prospective students.<sup>6</sup> If you do not indicate any intended changes to

fees in the AFI return and you have an approved APP, you may be required to submit an APP variation request to the Director for Fair Access and Participation.<sup>7</sup> We expect to publish guidance in July 2021 regarding collection of 2022-23 fee levels.
