Measures certified as being below <i>de minimis</i> (measures with an equivalent annual net direct cost to business (EANDCB) below +/- £5 million)	Regulatory notices : In this period the OfS introduced an ongoing condition of registration to enable the OfS to intervene more quickly and in a targeted way when we consider there to be a material risk that a registered provider may cease the provision of higher education. The condition applies from 1 April 2021 to all providers registered with the OfS, except Further Education Bodies (as defined in section 4 of the Technical and Further Education Act 2017).
	Regulatory guidance : Guidance which helps providers to understand and meet our requirements. These do not form part of the regulatory framework.
	The OfS published new guidance documents dealing with advice about notifications about third parties, the OfS's approach to determining the amount of a monetary penalty, and updated guidance for registered providers about the events or matters they are required to report to the Office for Students (OfS) to inform the OfS's risk-based approach to monitoring. This guidance on reportable events sets out the way in which we are delivering in practice on our commitment that providers that do not pose specific increased risk should experience less regulatory burden.

Changes to management of regulator	The term of office of the new chair of the OfS board, James Wharton, also known as Lord Wharton of Yarm, began on 1 April 2021 replacing Sir Michael Barber, the outgoing chair.
