OfS publication scheme

- The Freedom of Information Act requires every public authority to have a publication scheme approved by the Information Commissioner's Office, and to publish information covered by the scheme. Our publication scheme sets out the different types of information we make available and how to obtain them. It follows the Information Commissioner's model publication scheme and definition document for non-departmental public bodies.
- 2. The Office for Students (OfS) is committed to making information available as part of our normal business activities whenever we can legally do so, except where we consider release would cause significant harm. In such cases we will withhold information under an appropriate exemption in the Freedom of Information Act. We must also comply with the requirements of the data protection legislation and respect the privacy of individuals.
- 3. As the OfS is a newly created organisation (legally formed in January 2018), some of the information in the publication scheme will be supplied in due course.

- 24. Board papers are available on the <u>papers presented to the OfS board</u> section of the website. From 1 April 2018, board papers will normally be made available on the OfS website three weeks after the meeting at which they are put forward.
- 25. Papers exempt from publication under the Freedom of Information Act, including partly exempt papers, are listed for information with the other papers.

Assessing equality impact

Subject to relevance and proportionality, equality impact will be assessed on all policies and programmes and the outcomes of those assessments will be published on our website under <u>publications</u>. By assessing equality impact we proactively consider the needs of students, the wider community or our own employees and identify potential steps to advance equality and foster good relations, and ensure that we do not discriminate unlawfully.
