

Full privacy notice for the arrangements following the closure of Spurgeon's College

1. Introduction

The Office for Students ('OfS') is the regulator of the higher education sector in England and has certain statutory functions set out in the Higher Education and Research Act (HERA) 2017. You can find more information about the OfS and the work that we do on our website: www.officeforstudents.org.uk

As the independent regulator of higher education in England we have a role to help ensure that when a higher education provider such as Spurgeon's College closes, you are able to carry on with your studies or receive credit for your academic attainment to date.

We are committed to protecting your personal information and being clear about what information we hold about you and how we use it.

This privacy notice explains our use of your personal information to facilitate the arrangements for you to continue your studies at an alternative higher education provider.

The OfS is registered with the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO). Our registration number is ZA309955 and you can check our entry details on the ICO's website: https://ico.org.uk/ESDWebPages/Search.

2. Data controller and Data Protection Officer

The OfS is the 'data controller' of any personal information collected within scope of this privacy notice. Our location and contact details are below:

Our Data Protection Officer (DPO) is the first point of contact for people whose information is processed. You can contact the DPO using the details above. You should note that this email address is monitored by other members of the OfS's data protection team. Therefore, please mark any correspondence 'for the attention of the Data Protection Officer'.

If you choose to continue your studies at another provider of higher education you should contact this provider for further information about its use of your personal information as it is a separate data controller for personal information used for its own purposes.

3. What personal information we will hold and use

The personal information we hold for students that were registered at Spurgeon's College between 2002 and 2025 is set out below:

- Full name
- Educational records and attainment.

4. Our purpose for using the information

We can only use your personal information where we have a specific purpose or purposes for doing so.

As the independent regulator of higher education in England we have a role to help ensure that when a higher education provider such as Spurgeon's College closes, you are able to carry on with your studies or receive credit for your academic attainment to date. The purpose of using your personal information is to facilitate the arrangements for the transfer of your studies.

We also hold records of previous students of Spurgeon's college dating back to 2002. The purpose of retaining this data is to support our regulatory functions and to ensure that all students (current and past) are able to access evidence of their academic records and achievements in the future.

If we want to use your personal information for a reason other than those purposes set out above, we will update this notice and provide further information about the new purpose(s).

5. Legal basis for using your personal information

Under data protection legislation, we require a legal basis to be able to process your personal information for the purposes set out above.

In this case, the legal basis is:

• **UK GDPR Article 6(1)(e) Public task:** the processing is necessary to perform a task in the public interest or for our official functions, and the task or function has a clear basis in law.

In this case, section 38(1)(d) of HERA 2017 which allows the OfS to "facilitate [...] the provision of arrangements by registered higher education providers for student transfers".

Furthermore, as the lead regulator for higher education in England, retaining the data is necessary to support our regulatory functions.

6. Information we obtain from other sources

We obtain personal information about you from other sources, listed below

 Using our statutory powers to require information from providers, we obtained the information set out in section 3 from Spurgeon's College before it closed.

Legal basis for obtaining personal information from other source(s)

• **UK GDPR Article 6(1)(e) Public task:** the processing is necessary to perform a task in the public interest or for our official functions, and the task or function has a clear basis in law.

In this case, under section 38(1)(d) of HERA 2017 (which allows the OfS to "facilitate [...] the provision of arrangements by registered higher education providers for student transfers") and to support our regulatory functions.

7. Who we share your personal information with and why

We will share your personal information to some other organisations for specific reasons, as explained below:

- If you have chosen to continue your studies at an alternative higher education provider, we will share your name and academic transcript to enable them to register you.
- Should a suitable third-party organisation be identified to facilitate the archival of student records in perpetuity, we will share your name and academic transcript with them to safeguard this information for the future.

We will not disclose your information to any other organisation other than as listed except where required to do so as part of our functions or by law.

8. How long we hold your personal information

We are only able to retain a copy of your personal information as long as it is still needed for the purpose(s) for which it was collected.

- For current students of Spurgeon's College, your personal information will be kept by the OfS
 as long as necessary to facilitate the transfer of your studies to another provider of higher
 education and no longer than August 2028.
- For former students of Spurgeon's College your personal information will be kept by the OfS
 until such time as the provider is removed from the register, or a suitable third-party archive is
 identified.

After that point, your personal information will be confidentially and securely disposed of. If we need to keep your personal information for longer than the retention period above, we will update this notice explaining the reasons for this.

9. Where your personal information will be stored

Your personal information will be stored on servers in EEA and will not be transferred outside that territory unless required by a court order.

10. How we protect your personal information

We have a number of security measures in place to protect your personal information, including:

- Accredited to the <u>Cyber Essentials</u> PLUS standard for cybersecurity
- All staff are required to undertake training in data protection and information security on joining the OfS
- Formal information security policies that must be read and understood by all staff
- Personal information is only available to those members of staff who require access as part of their role
- Sharing of personal data will take place using secure means

11. Your rights over your personal information

Once your personal information has been collected, you have certain rights in relation to that personal information that may be exercised. You have the right to request:

- A copy of your personal information
- Inaccurate personal information held about you is corrected
- Your personal information to be deleted
- Processing of your personal information is restricted
- A copy of your information in a format that allows easy transfer ('data portability')
- That you are not subject to automated decision making or profiling (if these take place).

All these rights have certain limitations depending on the request and the purpose for which we are holding your personal information.
