

## Uni Connect monitoring data 2023-24

Uni Connect partnerships submitted monitoring reports to the Office for Students (OfS) in October 2024 for delivery of the programme in the 2023-24 academic year. These allowed us to gain a clear picture of how the partnerships are delivering activity to:

- meet the programme aims
- inform evaluation of the programme
- inform future policy and funding development.

Partnerships submit a monitoring report which collects information on finances, governance and operations. Alongside this, they submit an activity and learner engagement tracking report, produced by their chosen tracking system, which provides aggregated data on activities delivered and learners engaged.

### Monitoring data tables

The data in this document features in the Uni Connect 2023-24 data snapshot report<sup>1</sup> and is taken from the OfS monitoring reports and tracking reports, covering the academic year August 2023 to July 2024. This is a continuation of previous data reporting collected from programme monitoring and reports on the same categories as the previous (2022-23) snapshot report.<sup>2</sup> In 2023-24, partnerships also began providing attainment-raising activities and additional data on this has been included in the latest data snapshot.
